Please note: Positive rates should be at or below 5 percent for at least 14 days before a state or country can safely reopen, according to the World Health Organization. The Harvard Global Health group estimates that communities need to test widely enough so that the number of people testing positive for the virus is 3% or lower in order adequately suppress the pandemic. In the US, the current positive rate is 4.9% with the cumulative positive rate at 14.1%.

The Harvard Global Health group estimates that communities in Missouri should aim for 212 tests/100,000 citizens each day to mitigate outbreaks and 767 tests/100,000 citizens each day to suppress the virus. Testing in Independence and

Eastern Jackson County are far below these numbers. In the last seven days of available data (the week of October 5 - 11), <u>Eastern Jackson County averaged 527 tests per day or approximately 127 tests/100,000 citizens each day.</u>

City of Independence Gating Criteria for Re-opening


- 1. Sustained decrease in the number of confirmed cases and positive rate for at least four weeks.

- 4. Adequate access to testing and contact tracing.





Jurisdiction Comparison on Hospital Resource Usage






Graphical Eastern Jackson County Data
