To date, the City of Independence has seen <u>94 confirmed cases among staff</u>: twenty-six in the Fire Department, thirty in the Police Department, fifteen in the Utilities Department, nine in Municipal Services, one in Animal Services, two in Municipal Court, two in Finance & Administration, three in Community Development, one in the City Manager's Office, and five in the Parks/Recreation/Tourism Department.

Please note: Positive rates should be at or below 5 percent for at least 14 days before a state or country can safely reopen, according to the World Health Organization. The Harvard Global Health group estimates that communities need to test widely enough so that the number of people testing positive for the virus is 3% or lower in order adequately suppress the pandemic. In the US, the current positive rate is 13.3% with the cumulative positive rate at 19.04%.

The Harvard Global Health group estimates that communities in Missouri should aim for 212 tests/100,000 citizens each day to mitigate outbreaks and 767 tests/100,000 citizens each day to suppress the virus. Testing in Independence and Eastern Jackson County are far below these numbers. In the last seven days of available data (the week of December 7 - 13), Eastern Jackson County averaged 503.29 tests per day or approximately 121 tests/100,000 citizens each day.

City of Independence Gating Criteria for Re-opening

- 1. Sustained decrease in the number of confirmed cases and positive rate for at least four weeks.
- 2. Adequate PPE supply for hospitals, long-term care facilities, and first responders.
- 3. Sustained decrease in hospitalizations.
- 4. Adequate access to testing and contact tracing.




