AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY'S CURRENT USE TAX TO ALLOW FUNDING TO BE UTILIZED FOR ALL POLICE DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT; AND PROVIDING FOR SUBMISSION OF THE PROPOSAL TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY FOR THEIR APPROVAL AT THE SPECIAL ELECTION CALLED AND TO BE HELD IN THE CITY ON NOVEMBER 2<sup>ND</sup>, 2021, AND PROPOSING THE FORM OF THE BALLOTS TO BE EMPLOYED AT SAID ELECTION AND DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO DO ALL THINGS CALLED FOR BY LAW IN CONNECTION WITH THE HOLDING OF SAID ELECTION.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 19011, and approved by the qualified voters of the City on August 6, 2019, the City currently imposes a local use tax at the rate of 2.25%; and,

WHEREAS, the local use tax has been dedicated to funding a no-kill animal shelter and additional police officer for the Independence Police Department; and,

WHEREAS, in order to improve public safety services and fully utilize the revenue generated by the local use tax, the City has determined that the police portion of the local use tax should be available for all Police Department personnel and equipment; and

WHEREAS, amending the local use tax to allow for funding all Police Department personnel and equipment would not have any effect on how other funding is approved or utilized, including funds dedicated to the animal shelter; and

WHEREAS, once the funding needs related to the animal shelter and Police Department personnel and equipment are met, the remainder of the local use tax shall flow into City funds in the same manner as the City's total local sales tax is allocated; and

WHEREAS, amending how the local use tax revenue is utilized requires approval by the qualified voters of the City; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDEPENDENCE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The rate of the tax, currently set at two and one quarter percent (2.25%), shall not be changed by approval of this ballot question. If any City sales tax is repealed or the rate thereof is reduced or raised by voter approval, the City use tax rate also shall be deemed to be repealed, reduced or raised by the same action repealing, reducing, or raising the city sales tax.

SECTION 2. This ballot question shall be submitted to the qualified voters of Independence, Missouri, for their approval, as required by the provisions of Section 144.757

RSMo, at the Special Election hereby called and to be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November, 2021. The ballot of submission shall contain substantially the following language:

Shall the local use tax currently imposed by the City of Independence, Missouri, which is dedicated to a no-kill animal shelter and funding additional police officers, be amended to allow for the funding of all police department personnel and equipment? Voting in favor of this question will not result in any tax increase or change the funding dedicated to the no-kill animal shelter.

SECTION 3. Within ten (10) days after the approval of this proposition by the qualified voters of the City of Independence, Missouri, the City Clerk shall forward to the Director of Revenue of the State of Missouri by United States Registered Mail or Certified Mail, a certified copy of this ordinance together with certifications of the election returns and accompanied by a map of the City clearly showing the boundaries thereof.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
