To date, the City of Independence has seen **161** confirmed cases among staff: forty-four in the Fire Department, sixty-one in the Police Department, twenty-three in the Utilities Department, twelve in Municipal Services, three in Health & Animal Services, two in Municipal Court, three in Finance & Administration, three in Community Development, one in the City Manager's Office, and ten in the Parks/Recreation/Tourism Department.

Please note: Positive rates should be at or below 5% for at least 14 days before a state or country can safely reopen, according to the World Health Organization. The Harvard Global Health group estimates that communities need to test widely enough so that the number of people testing positive for the virus is 3% or lower in order adequately suppress the pandemic. In the US, the current positive rate is **15.0%**.














# Jurisdiction Comparison on Hospital Resource Usage All Hospital Beds Adult ICU Beds
