Summary of the Englewood Where Art Lives sign

The concept for this sign was put forth, in kind, by the Bernstein-Rein marketing firm and the Englewood community immediately became excited about it. The sign will be an iconic callout for the Englewood Arts District, similar to the Hollywood sign in California.

The sign is about 42 feet long and will be about 16 feet high. The white letters will be lit with lights shining on them, and the neon lights up. It is now being stored safely during the MEP portion of the building's renovation.

It is incredible to see how much excitement has been around the sign already. As soon as the neon is turned on people react with such delight. The community is very excited to display this on the roof for the area. It very well could be Independence's "Western Auto" icon.
