ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT TO OPERATE A BODY ARTS SERVICES BUSINESS AT 13700 E. US 40 HIGHWAY, SUITE F, IN INDEPENDENCE, MISSOURI.

WHEREAS, the application submitted by the City of Independence, requesting approval of a Special Use Permit to allow for the operation of a body arts services business at 13700 E. US 40 Highway, Suite F, was referred to the Planning Commission; and,

WHEREAS, the Unified Development Ordinance provides for the approval of a Special Use Permit by the City following public hearings by the Planning Commission and City Council; and,

WHEREAS, after due public notice in the manner prescribed by law, the Planning Commission held a public hearing for the consideration of the request on June 14, 2022 and rendered a report to the City Council recommending the Special Use Permit be approved by a vote of 6-0; and,

WHEREAS, after due public notice in the manner prescribed by law, the City Council held a public hearing on July 18, 2022, and rendered a decision to approve the Special Use Permit for the said property; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Unified Development Ordinance, it was determined that the request was consistent with the review criteria in Section 14-704-09.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDEPENDENCE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following described tract of real estate is hereby declared subject to the Special Use Permit approved by this ordinance. The site is legally described as follows:

Range 32, Township 49, Section 26; Part of the West 10-acres of the South 27-acres of the East ½-acre of the Northwest ¼-acre, lying North of 40 Highway and East of Washington Street

SECTION 2. That the Special Use Permit is hereby approved with the conditions listed below.

1. This Special Use Permit is restricted to 13700 E. US Highway 40, Suite F, only;
2. An opaque door (wood or metal) shall be repaired on the existing trash enclosure;
3. The applicant will obtain and maintain all applicable City and State licenses and comply with all health requirements.

SECTION 3. Any other uses on the property described by Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be governed by the base zoning district and other applicable regulations of the Unified Development Ordinance.

SECTION 4. Nonseverability. All provisions of this ordinance are so essentially, and inseparable connected with, and so dependent upon, each other that no such provision would be enacted without all others. If a court of competent jurisdiction enters a final judgement on the merits that is not subject to appeal and that declares any provision or part of this ordinance void, unconstitutional, or

unenforceable, then this ordinance, in its collective entirety, is invalid and shall have no legal effect as of the date of such judgement.

SECTION 5. Scrivener’s Errors. Typographical errors and other matters of a similar nature that do not affect the intent of this ordinance, as determined by the City Clerk and City Counselor, may be corrected with the endorsement of the City Manager without the need to come before City Council.

SECTION 6. That failure to comply with all the provisions contained in this ordinance shall constitute violations of both this ordinance and Chapter 14, the Unified Development Ordinance, of the Code of the City of Independence, Missouri.
