Hartman Heritage Center Community Improvement District Independence, Missouri Annual Report for Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2022

The Hartman Heritage Center Community Improvement District ("District") was formed on October 21, 2002, per adoption of Ordinance No. 15257 by the City Council of the City of Independence, Missouri, approving the Petition to Establish the Hartman Heritage Center Community Improvement District ("Petition"). The District is a political subdivision created under the authority of Sections 67.1401 through 67.1571 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, otherwise known as the Missouri Community Improvement District Act ("Act"), and is transacting business and exercising the powers granted by the Act. This Annual Report has been prepared pursuant to Section 67.1471.4 of the Act.

The District's Board of Directors annually establishes and levies a special assessment against all real property located within the District. Pursuant to the Petition, the District is authorized to levy special assessments in an amount not to exceed thirty-five cents (\$0.35) per square foot of gross building area in the District, with such amount being adjusted annually beginning in 2003 pursuant to the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers as reported by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Pursuant to the Consumer Price Index, as of the date of the 2022 annual meeting, the District was authorized to levy special assessments in an amount not to exceed forty-eight cents (\$0.48) per square foot of gross building area in the District. The special assessment rate established by the District for 2021 was \$0.18 per square foot of gross building area, to be assessed against all benefited real property located within the boundaries of the District on July 1, 2022. The District held its 2022 annual meeting on May 17, 2022. Copies of resolutions adopted during the fiscal year are attached to this Annual Report.

Consistent with the District Purposes as stated in the Petition, the District provided the following services and took the following actions during its fiscal year ending June 30, 2022:

- 1. <u>Maintenance</u>. The District maintained District common area and public right-of-way as authorized by the District's board of directors, which maintenance included, but was not limited to, mowing, fertilizing, repairs, landscaping, special lighting, special signage and irrigation.
- 2. <u>Public Relations, Marketing and Development</u>. The District supported business activity and economic development in the District and promoted tourism, recreational or cultural activities and/or special events in the District.
- 3. <u>Assessment Collections</u>. Collected the special assessment levied in 2021 to pay costs incurred by the District during the fiscal year.
- 4. <u>Assessment Levy.</u> Levied the 2022 special assessment to pay the estimated costs to be incurred by the District during the upcoming fiscal year.

All actions taken since the Districts formation up to and including the date of this Resolution by the officers of the District, by or on behalf of the District that are consistent with their powers under the Act and which are in the furtherance of the projects proposed in the Petition, are hereby ratified, acknowledged, and accepted.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION OF THE HARTMAN HERITAGE CENTER COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, ESTABLISHING THE RATE OF LEVY OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS WITHIN THE DISTRICT AND APPROVING THE DISTRICT'S LEVY OF THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, the Hartman Heritage Center Community Improvement District ("District") was formed on October 21, 2002, by the City Council of the City of Independence, Missouri, by the passing of Ordinance No. 15257, which approved the Petition to Establish the Hartman Heritage Center Community Improvement District ("Petition");

WHEREAS, the District is a political subdivision created under the authority of Section 67.1401 through Section 67.1571 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, otherwise known as the Missouri Community Improvement District Act ("Act"), and is transacting business and exercising the powers granted by the Act;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section III.D.2 of the Petition, the District's Board of Directors is authorized to establish and levy the special assessment for each calendar year against all real property located within the District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Exhibit E attached to the Petition, the District is authorized to levy special assessments in an amount not to exceed thirty-five cents (\$0.35) per square foot of gross building area in the District, with such amount being adjusted annually beginning in 2003 pursuant to the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers as reported by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics ("Consumer Price Index"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Consumer Price Index, as of the date of the 2022 District annual meeting, the District is authorized to levy special assessments in an amount not to exceed \$0.51 cents per square foot of gross building area in the District; and

WHEREAS, the District's Board of Directors has determined that it is appropriate to set the special assessment rate to be levied within the District and to set the date on which the special assessment is to be levied.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE HARTMAN HERITAGE CENTER COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The special assessment rate to be levied against all real property located within the District shall be \$0.18 per square foot of gross building area.

Section 2. The special assessment rate established in Section 1 of this Resolution is to be assessed against all real property located within the boundaries of the District on July 1, 2022, or, if any building within the District has not received a certificate of occupancy as of said date, the date on which such building is issued a certificate of occupancy during the District's fiscal year.

Section 3. The Chairman, Secretary and District counsel are authorized and directed to take all further action necessary to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
