Independence has the highest suicide rate in the KC area


Suicides with firearms contributes the most to this rate

Figure 17: Mortality Rate: Stroke, 2009-2020




Figure 16: Mortality Rate: Heart Disease, 2009-2020





Figure 18: Mortality Rate: Chronic Lower Respiratory Disease 2009-2020
